To Be Noted: Updates to Governing Documents

Last year, the board approved revising the governing documents to be consistent with updated Illinois HOA laws. Revisions are currently in progress and, upon completion, will be on the website replacing the current governing documents.

KEEPING HOMES AND PROPERTIES IN OPTIMAL CONDITION:

During a brief drive around of the neighborhood, the management company noted that there are numerous homes that are not in compliance with the rules and regulations of Trinity Lakes regarding the appearance of structures and properties.

Below is a topic list of the most commonly observed areas of non-compliance:

- Garbage Bins left out too long and visible from the street
- Basketball hoops not properly weighted or missing parts or extremely worn
- Driveways in need of repair and/or removal of weeds
- Landscaping requiring attention
- General home repair

Residents can find the entire description of these rules on the website by clicking "Documents" along the left side navigation pane, and then clicking on "Rules and Regulations"

NOTE: Resident access is *not* required to view these documents

Visual inspections will be conducted in June and letters will be sent out to homeowners who need to address specific areas. These letters will simply serve as a first notice so that residents have ample time to address any issues.
